Where are the Multiplying Disciples?

In July I recorded and shared a video that was calling Christian youths of my generation to consider returning to their villages to share the gospel of Jesus Christ. Their maternal and paternal ancestral lands that raised their parents have people who deserve to hear the gospel. Some of these family relations are far away from God and are considered by many in my generation as "not-the-right-people" to associate with. They have altars raised for worship of fallen spirits that they serve following the footsteps of their forefathers. Their lives are blanketed in fear and propelled by superstition. Satan has turned them into objects of mockery, yet Jesus paid a heavy price for their freedom. Who will rescue these children of God from the devil's dungeon?

This year on October 8th, I will be making 33 years. As I reflect on my life, God is revealing to me the ways He has made all things to work together for good. The single most important milestone I reflect on is this blessing of knowing God as my loving Father and to be reconciled to Him through His son, My Savior Jesus Christ.

Knowing God as Father has transformed me and my perception of life. From scripture the men and women who came to saving faith through Jesus committed their lives to lead many others to Christ. That is how the church of Christ grew from a small band of disciples to multiplying disciples.

How has knowing God as my Loving Father impacted my life?

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Muduuma Children and Youths' Workers' Network

God is multiplying disciples in our Muduuma sub-county . In July God entrusted to us a vision to reach 30 pastors from 30 churches to encourage them in ways they can effectively reach the next generation with the gospel. We have hosted these pastors, their Sunday School teachers and youths leaders at in our school hall for two day trainings in July and September. We realized that COVID19 left many of these ministers discouraged because many people left their congregations because of unavoidable transitions. One pastor reported "It reached a time when the only people I could minister to are children, but I did not know how to share the gospel with them."

We have encouraged them to be intentional to reach children, teenagers and youths because they are the majority, are available and most receptive to the gospel.

Our training menu includes courses designed by the Global 4-14 Window Movement and 1 for 50 teams. Our strategy is to empower one teacher to effectively reach children from their communities with the gospel. 72 leaders taking part in our first co-hort have been equipped with methods and materials to use to effectively communicate the gospel to the youngsters in their villages.

Our key partner in providing materials, media and training is One Hope and they have committed to walk this journey with our partner churches for two years learning and sharing lessons learnt.

A whatsapp group has been created where leaders regularly share prayer and updates in their respective ministries.

Networking with 30 churches to reach children and youths




“Churches working together will reach more children in Muduuma sub county than one church could ever reach”

- 3. **Ultimate Goal**— for teenage boys aged 13 and above. Each church received 50 books to reach 50 boys.




Inspiring University students to reach the next generation

August 2022

Together with Ritah, we were blessed to share with students at African Bible University of Uganda (my former school) our vision of reaching the next generations. We were invited by Mrs. Cheri Hoke, Lecturer and my former teacher who wanted to use our ministry story to inspire students taking her

Instructing Children's Heart Course.

Our main thesis was to encourage the students to go out and become a present living witness sharing Christ's love with children and youths in tangible ways. We illustrated the importance of holistic children's ministry and how it impacts families and brings transformation in entire communities. Our hope is that God will stir many of these students to commit their lives to reaching the next generations.



Imagine a World Without Sickness

One Hope provided us a rare opportunity with our teenagers to review a new tool that they are going to roll out globally. It is the "World Without Sickness Book" it shares from the Bible God's plan to bring health to our bodies and souls.

The material shares basic hygiene tips with creative illustrations.

Children were able to give their feedback on the contextual applications and illustrations.



Mentoring Boys through Sports to become disciples

God has been faithful throughout the last three months. He blessed us with a harvest of 17 boys who gave their lives to Jesus through the Boys' Mentorship sports camp which we organized in conjunction with two other churches. Using football, we have been able to mobilise boys aged 10 to 25 years for fellowship and fun. Football has proven an effective tool to

teach boys team work, discipline, persistence and goal setting.

During the Camp help from 28th to 31st August 2022 at the shores of Lake Victoria, boys were engaged in bible study to discover and understand the subject of our sonship in God through Christ. In small groups of 12 boys studied several bible

passages and memorized verses about sonship. Several of us leaders shared our testimonies and we got a visiting pastor from Kenya who shared his life touching story of how knowing Christ gave him hope. Two videos were also showed to the campers from brethren Keith Brown and Timothy Dommer.

Advanced Trauma Care Training by Trauma Free World

July 2022 God enabled me attend the Advanced Trauma Care Training conducted by Trauma Free World. The three day training combined theological and psychology concepts and shared many practical ways to detect and address trauma among children. Starting in August 2022 I have been sharing with

our staff at school and volunteers at church the information we were instructed in. This is supplementing the studies we have been doing in the materials from Sweeten Life Systems on Teleios "comforting children and families" through learning healthy relationship skills.

Celebrating 1 year of sharing the gospel with Safe clean water

Having successfully drilled a production well last year, children and families from the community surrounding our school have accessed clean and safe water. Apart from the few electricity connection challenges, we are very thankful to God that the well never runs dry. Throughout the dry season water continues to flow and presents us with opportu-

nities to share and share God's love to new comers who have just settled in our village.

The Jesus Fountain well has made fetching water for children safe because its located in a safe environment with monitoring of adults unlike when kids used to go into secluded swamps to fetch water surrounded by bushes and

forest.

Some children after coming to fetch water have made friends with children in our school who are actively witnessing to them life in Christ.

Meals at school are prepared in time because we do not have to fetch water it is available at the tap. Praise God for the Jesus Fountain well!

Feeding Program

supplies including sugar, wheat flour, maize flour, rice, salt, cooking oil and beans

Our children's feeding program was boosted with 20 boxes of rice from Mannapack. This specially packed rice has soya and other useful ingredients that children are enjoying.

During July to September, 20 families have received food

In celebration of my 33rd birthday I intend to raise funds to build a boys' dormitory to house 100 boys at our school. This is because we cannot host boys at our home where we already foster 3 boys aged 10, 14 and 15 years. The boys' dormitory will provide safe living environment for boys aged 8-15 year. From here we can disciple and mentor them.

The building will host a 5000 volume library, sleeping space, reading area and toilet facilities.



Knowing God as Father has filled me with hope.

God has used anointed men to provide me a second chance to experience the love of an earthly father. My late grandfather Enos Henry Ssekibone took up care for me after the passing of my mother. He would have passed on this responsibility to my dad but with compassion he knew dad's job in the military would not afford him enough time to care for my needs besides the other siblings that dad had got from his other wives. Apart from becoming my new dad, grandpa introduced me to a local Anglican church, supported my education and modeled responsibility to me. I knew from looking at grandpa that

when I grew up, I wanted to be a responsible God fearing man. God also brought me nurturing pastors and teachers at our local church and school.

God's love for me inspired and equipped me to enter a covenantal marriage relationship and found a family. Committing to a covenantal marriage is out of appreciating God's character of a permanent, ever-loving Father. He adopted us and had no plans to abandon us. My generation has very low appreciation of the importance of covenantal marriage and opts for casual cohabitation relationships which give more "freedom."

God's love for me inspired me to go into full time ministry to share the gospel of Jesus Christ to children, youths, and families. Am glad to be serving in the Muduma sub county where my late father was raised. I frequently encounter people who knew my dad and am blessed to share with them the love of Jesus.

What does my loving Father want me to do at 33 years old?

Am convicted that God intends to work through my life testimony to inspire and multiply disciples.

Am intentionally drawing close to boys and young men most of whom have not yet experienced the Father's love of God. Many have been hurt by their father's neglect and to some early loss. They have no story to share when it comes to experiencing the love of a father. Making them know they have a heavenly Father who loves and cares for them is essential to break the cycle of abandonment. I believe God is stirring them to become intentional at sharing the Father's love to those around them.
